Have you ever considered the likelihood of a home fire?

Well, chances are you **WILL** have one...

The N.F.P.A. estimates that:

The U.S. fire departments respond to an average of 366,600 home fires per year



And that these fires cause an estimated 13,210 civilian injuries and \$7.2 billion in direct property damage per year

Most Common Fire Sources

Cooking equipment is the leading cause of home structure fires and non-fatal home fire injuries.



Smoking materials are the leading cause of home fire deaths.
